We were also an active participant in the Association for the Study of African American Life and History (ASALH) conference held in Jacksonville, Florida. The conference theme, "Black Resistance," resonated strongly with us. I would like to extend my thanks to Dr. Dulaney and the entire ASALH team for their warm reception of BH365; we are proud to note that ASALH has also voted to use our textbooks and materials in all their Freedom Schools nationwide.

In terms of new offerings, our Latino History textbook is complete and in the editing stage, with printing scheduled for no later than January. This will allow for spring implementation into school districts, who are eagerly awaiting this addition to our catalog. In this innovative textbook series, we delve deep into the rich tapestry of Latino cultures, identities, and contributions. From the Aztec

and Incan empires to modern-day leaders, this comprehensive resource reveals the historical origins of key Latin American countries like Mexico, Colombia, and Brazil, as well as the broader Hispanic world, including Puerto Rico, Cuba, and the Dominican Republic. Also, we will be releasing a Caribbean history textbook as well. Our goal is to connect the dots and close the diaspora gaps that have been established through, colonization, nationalism, divide and conquer, victimization and genocide. Our work is our love letters to the world.






Together, these developments mark significant steps in our ongoing journey to make a lasting impact on education and society.



SPOTLIGHT: MEET MIA STREET

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, BH365 FOUNDATION

We are excited to introduce our newly appointed Executive Director of the Black History 365 Education Foundation Inc. The BH365 Education Foundation is a non-profit organization that raises funds to provide educational resources and services for under-served communities. The Foundation supports Black History 365 Education's mission, in creating cutting edge resources that invite individuals, in under-served communities, to become critical thinkers, compassionate listeners, fact-based, respectful communicators, and action-oriented solutionists.

An award winning educator, Mia Street comes from a bloodline of educational activists and trailblazers. Her roots are embedded in the parishes of Louisiana that created the Deacons For Defense, the first Black students to force integration at La Tech University and a family that has dedicated their lives to the promise and potential of education.

She grew up listening to stories about her grandfather, Moses Lee Osborne, who led the efforts to teach black folks in Jackson Parish Louisiana how to read in order to prepare them to register and vote. It is no surprise that Mia's work, inside and outside of the classroom, is rooted in this dedication to education as a tool for Liberation.

Her journey in education led her to teaching and developing culturally responsive curriculum for special needs children for nearly 20 years. Previously, Mia worked with Georgia State University and the The King Center to assist in student led events for the 50th Anniversary of the March on Washington. She is the founder of Kidada Education Design LLC and Bridging The Gap Mentoring Program, a 501c3 non-profit organization.

She specializes in leveraging partnerships with educational agencies and industry professionals to create and develop unique educational initiatives that serve marginalized student populations.

INTERVIEW WITH MIA STREET

What are you most excited about in your new roles as Executive Director of the Foundation?

I am absolutely thrilled about my new role as Executive Director of the BH365 Education Foundation! There are so many things that I am excited about, but what I am most honored by is the opportunity to make a meaningful impact on the lives of students in our community. I truly delight in being a part of an organization whose purpose is to provide inclusive educational resources to underserved communities. I am eager to collaborate with our dedicated team, passionate educators, and generous donors to provide innovative educational resources that will empower students to reach their full potential.

What is your vision for the first year?

I anticipate a long year ahead, simply because we are doing some groundbreaking work that will pave the way for the next five years. In doing so, we have created a couple of new initiatives, one being the "Adopt a School" program.
